

THE NEW MEDIA INTERDISCIPLINARY CERTIFICATE

The New Media Interdisciplinary Certificate (NMIC) is a credential certifying the student's understanding of and proficiency in new media. A student earns the NMIC while completing a degree in his or her chosen field of study. The NMIC guarantees that a graduate is expert in the application of technology within a given profession.

CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

To qualify for the NMIC students must:

- Complete eleven hours of certificate core courses with a B average or better
- Complete six hours of elective course with a B average or better

The NMIC takes a minimum of three semesters to complete.
